

## FROMBERG TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES FOR A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON APRIL 5, 2021

The April 5, 2021 meeting of the Fromberg Town Council was held at 118 W River Street in Fromberg. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the meeting was called to order by Mayor Tim Nottingham at 7:00 pm. Council members present were Dave Stapleton, Nate Caton and Frank "Bill" Gruel. Others present were Ilsa Dawson, Cyrill Hergenrider, Tammy Taylor, Marge Taylor, Elton Kirtley, Irwin Sankey, Sarah and Lloyd Mackenzie, Sherriff Officer Thompson, Public Works Director Jay Cater, Assistant Public Works Director Lacey Breeding and Clerk Pro Tem Kirstin Sweet.

The next item on the agenda was public comment. Tammy Taylor commented on a town wide cleanup and the possibility for a cash prize incentive!! Councilman Caton is working on a cleanup day with the high school kids and Sheriff Officer Thompson said the Sheriff Department would be happy to patrol the highway during the cleanup. Marge Taylor commented on the Town's ordinances regarding vacant buildings. Discussion was had regarding Town ordinances. Elton Kirtley commented regarding reimbursement for meters that were paid for in error. Discussion was had regarding the water meter reimbursement for property owners who paid for their meter and should not have been required to pay for the meter.

The next agenda item was the Carbon County Sherriff's report. Sheriff Officer Thompson gave a report regarding patrol in Town for the month of March.

The next item on the agenda was to appoint a council member. There was one letter of interest from Ilsa Dawson. Councilman Stapleton made a motion to appoint Ilsa Dawson to fill the vacant council seat. The motion was seconded by Councilman Caton. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Stapleton - aye, Councilman Caton - aye and Councilman Gruel -aye.

Councilwoman Ilsa Dawson was sworn in by Clerk Kirstin Sweet.

The next item of business was to elect a council president. Councilman Gruel suggested Councilman Caton. Councilman Caton expressed concerns regarding his work schedule. None of the members were concerned with his availability. Councilman Gruel made the motion, seconded by Councilman Stapleton. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Stapleton - aye, Councilman Caton - aye, Councilwoman Dawson - aye, and Councilman Gruel -aye.

Next on the agenda was the approval of the minutes from the March 1, 2021 regular meeting. Councilman Stapleton made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Councilman Caton. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Stapleton - aye, Councilman Caton - aye, Councilwoman Dawson - aye, and Councilman Gruel -aye.

The next item of business was the approval of claims for February. Councilman Stapleton motioned to approve claims including check #21859 to #21882. Also, electronic check # -99983 to -99982. The motion was seconded by Councilman Caton. The motion carried with the votes as follows: Councilman Stapleton - aye, Councilman Caton - aye, Councilwoman Dawson - aye, and Councilman Gruel -aye.
