

FROMBERG TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES OF A REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

HELD ON JUNE 14, 2022

The June 14, 2022 meeting of the Fromberg Town Council was held at 118 W River Street in Fromberg. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the meeting was called to order by President of the Council Nate Caton in place of Mayor Nottingham who had not arrived yet, at 7:00 pm. Council members present were Dave Stapleton, Nate Caton and James Lister. Others present were Clerk Lacey Breeding, Jerry Hall, Fausta Mcranie, Nikki Parker, Katy Caton, Rachel Grandfield, Jesse Sanchez, Brian Jones, Gayle Young, Karen Ulrickson, Pamela Holland and Aaron Muhs.

First, Councilman Caton informed everyone that Mayor Nottingham was in Red Lodge at Disaster meetings and that Caton would be stepping in for him. He also informed that this meeting would not be able to be run according to the normal agenda because of the flood disaster.

Carbon County Sheriff department was unable to attend.

Next was Public Comment. Karen Ulrickson led with a question on weather the flood disaster had compromised the lagoons. At this time Mayor Nottingham became present and he gave updates on any information that was known so far about the flood damages. Discussion was had about preparations for further future flooding concerns and about the efforts that had been put out so far. Tina Foust then shared the developments for relief she had come up with to help the affected residents.

After that was set to be the approval of the minutes from the previous month's meeting that was held on May 10, 2022. Councilman Stapleton made a motion to approve the minutes. Councilman Caton followed with a second and the motion was carried out with votes as follows: Councilman Caton, -aye, and Councilman Stapleton, -aye and Councilman Lister, -aye.

Next was the approval of the minutes from the meeting held on May 18, 2022. Councilman Stapleton made a motion to approve the minutes. Councilman Caton followed with a second and the motion was carried out with votes as follows: Councilman Caton, -aye, and Councilman Stapleton, -aye and Councilman Lister, -aye.

Next on the agenda was the approval of claims for the month of May 2022. It was agreed to postpone the claims for May 2022 until Clerk Breeding was allowed time to complete them in the midst of the flood situation.

Following that was the approval of payroll for the month of May 2022. Councilman Caton made a motion to approve the payroll and Councilman Stapleton seconded the motion. The motion was carried with

votes as follows; Councilman Caton, -aye and Councilman Stapleton, -aye and Councilman Lister, -aye.

Next on the agenda was the topic of providing a temporary seasonal water rate to residents. Discussion was had on the amount to set the cap at and all agreed to make it a trial experiment.

Then, Mayor Nottingham informed the room that the following item on the agenda was no longer needed because the County has decided to make further changes to the marijuana regulations. Mayor Nottingham explained that instead of paying to have a special election on the topic that it was his opinion that the town should wait and see what the county decides in the fall of 2022. The councilman agreed.

Next on the agenda was to decide what angle to stipulate for parking at the American Legion now that the paving project was complete. Discussion was had and it was decided on angled parking.

Attorney Moen was not present.

Mayor Nottingham then gave further details on the flood and warned that water needs to be conserved until further notice while the wells are down. He also explained what the current boil order meant.

Brian Jones then Introduced himself as a new resident to Fromberg and gave a future plan for the property they had purchased.

The next regular council meeting was set for July 12, 2022 and there being no further business, Councilman Stapleton made the motion to adjourn, followed by a second from Councilman Caton. The motion to Adjourn was carried out with votes as follows: Councilman Caton- aye. Councilman Stapleton- aye. Councilman Lister -aye.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:27 p.m.
